REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE TO ASK THE ATTENTION OF THE
PRESIDENT TO THE COMPLAINTS
OF GENERAL SIGEL.

THE undersigned Committee, appointed under a resolution of the War Committee, passed October 2, 1862, for the purpose of "representing to the government the necessity of examining the causes of General Sigel's late request to be relieved of his command, and of removing such causes if found to be true," beg to report :

That they have seen the President of the United States in regard to the subject referred to in the above resolution, and that the President fully appreciates the importance of retaining the services of Major-General Sigel to the government.

That the President ascribes the complaints of General Sigel to the exigencies of the war, and other causes entirely foreign to any disregard of General Sigel, and that we have reason to believe that the said causes will be removed.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
