

Freeing the Breath - 2011

First person loudly blows into cupped hands, seals cupped hands quickly and hands off the breath to next person's cupped hands.

After receipt of breath, that person seals cupped hands quickly and carefully hands off breath to the next person. Repeat this action up until last person in line.

Last person in line to receive the breath quickly seals cupped hands and then, with a grand gesture, frees the breath into the sky.

WALK - 2013

Assign a two or three word script to nine people who stand in a circle facing OUT.

Performer "C" walks around the circle and then throws one shoe in middle of circle, yelling "Shoe!" - Each time "C" passes a person, they must say a word from their script.

Performer "C" walks around the circle again and then throws the other shoe in middle of circle. yelling "Shoe!" - Again, each time "C" passes a person, they must say a word from their script.

The direction of walking might be changed anytime by "C" to improvise on sound of text.



Two Sound Events in Real Life and Real Time

Traffic in Real Life in Real Time (2014)

Program notes:

Setting: A traffic intersection during rush hour or other busy (or not so busy) period

Seating: Audience should be seated behind

the conductor on the sidewalk by traffic intersection

Event Score:

The conductor "conducts" the ambient and foreground traffic and other sounds s/he hears Be very expressive and dramatic in your conducting technique but don't overdo it

Tempo modulation and many quick tempo changes

are to be expected

As much as possible try to cue "solos", crescendos, decrescendos, et cetera

The piece ends when there is a sufficient lull in the sound

Quiet Spaces in Real Life in Real Time (2014)

Program notes:

Setting: A quiet space such as a nature preserve, wooded area, hillside, forest, etc. at any time Seating: Audience should be seated behind the conductor in the quiet place

Event Score:

The conductor "conducts" the ambient sounds s/he hears Be very expressive in your conducting technique Tempo modulation and some quick tempo changes are to be expected As much as possible try to cue "solos", crescendos, decrescendos, et cetera The piece ends when there is a sufficient lull in the sound

Score for Definitions, Part VII

Performer 1: I am Fluxus because I say I am Performer 2: (Slaps Performer 1 in the face.)

EMPATHY PIECE

On a musical instrument, a single note is played repeatedly.

The piece ends when the listener hears the player's heartbeat.

COMMUNICATION PIECE

A person breathes on a mirror and writes a word or message.

The mirror is passed to another person. The other person does not have to be close by.

The other person reads the word or message.

Optional: Repeat until the mirror is a book.

TRAFFIC PIECE

Listen to the hum of traffic.

When the traffic stops, start humming.

PHILANTHROPY PIECE

In the street, place a coin in a corner.

Let someone else gather the coins.

BANANA PIECE

Bananas are consumed.

Banana skins are tied to soles of feet.

A walk is taken.

ƏLLEN BUHOFF

1. Fluxus Sitdown - 2014

Pull one chair out of audience area and place in stage area. Sit on chair facing audience. Ask audience to perform.

2. How do you spell "Buchholz?" - 2014

Prepare 6 or more signs with different possible spellings of "Buchholz."

Present signs, two at a time and ask audience to vote on which of the two spellings they think is closer to being an accurate spelling. Pit the winners of each pairing against each other, asking the audience to vote, again.

Repeat until audience has arrived at final spelling choice through process of elimination.

3. Fluxus Midwest Marching School of Fish Balloon Band -1994

- variation of 1994 script

(see http://www.allenbukoff.com/FluxusMidwest/wexner/) Solicit 6 participants for marching band. Provide them with large floating balloons.

Ask them to walk around imitating a school of fish.

4. Fluxfest Group Photo with Large Balloons - 2014

Ask Fluxfest participants attending Sunday's activities at Cultural Center to pose for a group picture underneath a set of large floating balloons that spell "F-L-U-X-U-S."
